## **Some Welcomes**

We welcomed a new Parish Councillor, Keith Simmons, who is proving to be a conscientious councillor, supporting our village.

## **Public Participation**

The Parish Council is proud to represent the village and very grateful to all the residents who have managed to attend our online meetings. Sharing their views helps the Council make balanced decisions.

### **Road Safety**

We have formed a Traffic & Road Safety Working Groups, who will be exploring ways controlling and slowing down traffic passing through the village. Unfortunately, because of Covid-19, we were only able to carry out one practice Speed Watch session this year. However, following a very generous donation from County Councillor Irene Radcliffe, we will be able to purchase our own Speed Gun and hopefully resume Speed Watch Sessions in the summer.

# **Playing Field Contract**

We have a new contract for the maintenance of the Joint Playing Field with Fox Landscaping, who have taken over from Counsellor John Bradbury. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank John for the fantastic work he's done over the years.

## Village Warden

We interviewed and appointed Stuart Ford as the Village's Maintenance Warden. Stuart cleared the footpaths and caried out a wide range of maintenance duties throughout the village last summer and will be doing the same between May and October of 2021.

### **Telephone Box**

We purchased, renovated and fitted out the village telephone box with shelves, to convert it into a book exchange. The telephone box is now well stocked with books.

# Village Pump

We arranged for the village pump to be dismantled, repainted, and restored to its fully working former glory.

### **Planters**

We arranged for 3-tier floral planters to be placed outside the village hall and at the bottom of the village, opposite Pethills Lane for the first time, and we are very pleased that they will be in place again from June 2021.

### Website

We created a Website Working Group in order to identify and appoint a web site provider who could provide us with a new professional and fully compliant Parish Council Web Site.

### **Climate Change**

We have introduced Climate Change as a new regular item on our agendas, to ensure that potential environmental improvements and innovative ways of addressing climate change are considered and discussed at every meeting.
